Due to staff and training limitations, we are only able to make basic special need accommodations. Our staffing is 2:15 ratio, and we do not have 1:1 supervision or para-professional support. Students will need to be able to follow rules and safety precautions on our campus and on field trips as well as be comfortable in large group activities most of the day. **We reserve the right to decline participation if a student is unable to follow these safety standards.**

We strive to **develop the whole child**, mentally, physically, emotionally, spiritually and socially through structured group activities that aid in socialization, character development, and increased self-worth.

### **Registration:**

\$25 Non-Refundable w/ Registration per Child

### **WEEKLY RATES:**

First child: **\$160**

Additional child: **\$15 multi-child discount for non-grant recipients.**

**Grant Recipients must apply and qualify for assistance and are billed on a case-by-case basis.**

### **Registration**

Space is limited. Registrations will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. To secure a spot, complete and submit the Summer Day Camp Registration Application with your \$25 registration fee. Enrollment forms must be thoroughly completed in order to guarantee that staff have the necessary information to effectively provide care. Please note that incomplete forms may not be processed. A registration application must be completed for each child that is enrolled.

### **Payment Options**

Payment must be in the form of **cash, check or online payment**. Checks should be made payable to **The Salvation Army Noble Worship & Community Center**.

### **Payment**

Campers may not attend the program until the weekly payment has been made in advance. Payment must be received by **Thursday, for the following week**. This will be noted and reported during check-in.

## What to Bring

### Attire

The following dress code applies to all campers and staff:

- No short-shorts, halter tops, short midriff tops.
- Pants/shorts must be worn high/long enough so as not to expose undergarments or buttocks. With arms relaxed at sides shorts should be fingertip length.
- Undergarments must be always worn except when swimming.
- One-piece or tankini (covers midriff) swimsuits are the only acceptable swimsuit for girls. Swim trunks should be worn by boys.
- T-shirts or other clothing with inappropriate pictures or language are not acceptable.
- Please label all your belongings. The Salvation Army Noble Worship & Community Center is not responsible for lost or stolen items.
- Closed Toed Shoes with grip.
- Outside snaps, buttons, or ties are not recommended as they may catch during play.
- Skirts or dresses inhibit movement and are discouraged.
- Please send child in clothing and footwear that they can put on without assistance.
- Wear provided camp t-shirt for field trips.
- Bring or wear raincoat or umbrella for field trips.
- Bring a book to keep in cubby for quiet reading time.

### Sunscreen

Please bring sunscreen with your child's name on it. This will be left in their cubby at the location for their use throughout the summer.

### Swimsuit

Campers will have the opportunity for weekly water recreation. We ask that each camper **pack a labeled swim bag, swimsuit, towel, swim shoes, sunscreen and change of clothes and return it clean and dried after each use.** Campers without the necessary items may not be able to participate in the water activity that day.

### Lost Items

Lost and found items are kept in a bin for the remainder of the Summer Day Camp season and will be donated to the local Salvation Army Family Store after the program has ended. To inquire about lost and found items, please provide a detailed description of your missing item to a summer day camp counselor. The Noble Worship & Community Center is not responsible for lost or stolen items and you will not be reimbursed.

## What NOT to Bring

Below is a list of items that are **not allowed at day camp – NO EXCEPTIONS.** Should a camper bring said items, they will be held for safekeeping by the Day Camp Director to be returned to the Parent/Guardian at check-out. This policy is for the camper's safety; as well as, to encourage group interaction and participation.

- Cell Phones (See Communications Section) If communication is necessary, contact Camp Staff and they will communicate with students.
- Electronics: music players, games, cameras, etc.
- Expensive clothing, jewelry, money, or other items of value
- Skates, boots, heels, or shoes with wheels in the soles

- Personal toys or cards
- Pets
- Drugs or alcohol
- Real or pretend weapons
- Any other items the Day Camp Staff deems inappropriate

### **Money**

We do NOT encourage children to bring money to the Day Camp, unless otherwise stated. In the event an opportunity arises for campers to bring money to spend, parents will be notified in advance.

## **ON-BOARDING**

The Summer Day Camp program strives to offer every child the opportunity to participate in recreational activities that are both fun and educational, providing campers with the chance to learn new skills, foster relationships, and build self-confidence. Our staff works diligently to create a positive environment that is free from discrimination or other factors that may prohibit campers from having an enjoyable or safe experience at the Noble Worship & Community Center.

Every child deserves to have a positive experience, free from peer pressure, excessive negativity, and any other behavior that unfavorably affects his/her self-esteem and/or ability to fully participate in activities. We take bullying, of any kind, very seriously. Staff members are trained in utilizing constructive discipline techniques to create a positive environment that welcomes growth and learning. Our perspective on discipline is to teach not punish as we strive for the children to *learn*.

With each new camper that joins our Day Camp, staff members and campers discuss the rules and expectations of the program as we believe in a proactive approach as part of the onboarding process. All rules and expectations are used to create an environment that fosters openness, respect, and fun as children thrive creatively within a structured system.

## **FIELD TRIP DAY & TRANSPORTATION**

### **Field Trip Days**

Field trips will be held every Thursday & Friday to various locations throughout the twin cities. Locations may change due to availability and weather. You will be notified by text each week of the specifics of the field trip including bus times, destination, appropriate attire or special needs. Bag lunches will be provided for field trips provided by the Osseo Area School District. If students/families prefer the can send a lunch from home marked with students full name and the student is responsible for their lunch bag being returned to camp.

Noble will be chartering school buses for transportation and periodically use Salvation Army Vans to and from field trips during the summer. We will refer to the bus company's safety rules along with our own. ***PLEASE COMPLETE THE TRANSPORTATION CONSENT/ASSUMPTION OF RISK WAIVER TO PARTICIPATE IN FIELD TRIPS.***

## **Transportation Guidelines:**

- All passengers must remain seated at all times.
- Keep arms, legs, and other body parts to oneself.
- Do not leave the bus until instructed.
- No eating or drinking on the bus.
- Must pick up all trash and belongings before exiting the bus.
- Inside voices only.

## **Day Camp Community Expectations**

Community expectations are very important because they guide the way the whole group interacts and play together. Our Day Camp expectations are simple for the campers to remember:

### **1. Love Others**

John 15:12 says, “This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you.” This rule sets a precedence to come at every situation or to every individual with love. It teaches that we are all deserving and worthy of giving and receiving love. Children hear the message of, “You are loved. You are good. You are enough.” This allows the children to value others with kindness, respect, honor, and compassion.

### **2. Be Safe**

This rule adds needed structure to the entire group to help protect campers from injuries; as well as allow us to care for the camper in a direct way due to campers hearing the message, “You are safe. You will be taken care of.” Keeping this rule prominent in our groups, helps us establish a caring environment for our campers.

### **3. Stay Together**

This rule helps to keep all the campers engaged with each other while focusing on the here and now. It also provides the important message of, “You are important and connected to this group.” Staying together helps the camper feel noticed and valued because there is talk about missing a camper that is absent or not starting an activity until every camper is ready. This allows each camper to know that they will not be forgotten or excluded.

### **4. Have Fun**

We want our campers to just have fun because it brings joy to their lives and allows their experiences to be more impactful. Joy gives us the opportunity to connect while building relationships, overcoming challenges, and gaining new experiences. This makes the experiences of Noble’s Summer Day Camp lasting and far-reaching. This also gives campers the message that their feelings and happiness are important.

## **Disciplinary Action Plan**

In dealing with camper behavior and discipline issues, we will:

- Consider age-appropriate behavior.
- Affirm the person, not the behavior.
- Clearly communicate where they need to improve their actions/behavior.
- Simply and clearly share the consequences of the behavior.

WE NEVER DENY OR COMPROMISE: Meals, sleep, physical health/safety, emotional safety.

WE NEVER: Hit, slap, spank, shame, call names...or allow campers to do so.

WE NEVER IMPOSE OR ALLOW: Push-ups, cleaning the bathrooms, eating something unfavorable, removing clothing, dares, hurtful pranks, unsafe activities, embarrassing activities, or hazing.

Verbal Warning: The first instance where discipline is needed.

- INTERACT instead of REACT.
- Assess the situation and determine what has occurred, who are the offenders, is there an innocent party.
- Inform the campers that this behavior is not acceptable and will not be tolerated.
- Simply and clearly share the consequences of the behavior.

Camper Contract: Second instance where discipline is needed.

- Contact the Camp Director who will create a Camper Contract with the child and submit it to the Corps Officer.
- Inform the camper that if they break this contract, they may be choosing to go home rather than to stay and have fun at camp.
- Parents will be notified, and a copy of the contract will be shared.

Contract Review: Third instance where discipline is needed.

- Meet with the Camp Director, Corps Officer, and camper.
- Review the verbal warning and written contract with the child.
- Determine if an extension of the contract or dismissal from camp is appropriate. It will be stressed that the camper chose this outcome by their behavior.
- Parents will be given a report of this meeting.

Send Home: Fourth instance where discipline is needed.

- Camper will be dismissed from the summer camp with no refund.

### Zero Tolerance

If the behaviors include any physical contact (with another camper, staff member, leader or officer), threats, are sexual in nature, include any other behaviors which brought harm to any person or put others at risk of being harmed, the camper will be immediately expelled from camp. A Safe From Harm report will be completed by the leader/officer/staff member who witnessed the behavior. See the Safe From Harm procedure section for more information.

## Safe-From-Harm

All staff, leaders and officers must be up to date on their Safe From Harm training before Summer Day Camp begins.

Everyone needs to be familiar with Safe From Harm practices and will be accountable for adhering to them, including reporting and documentation. Contact Tessa Westlund (DHQ) if you have questions about certification, training, policies and/or reporting.

Please make a SFH report by both leaving a voicemail at the number below and completing an online report at the website below. In addition to the official SFH reporting, incidents should be shared immediately with the DYS and the Camp Program Director.

### Report

- Suspected, witnessed, or disclosed abuse, neglect, or exploitation
- Missing Persons
- Major Injuries (hospital visits)
- Inappropriate behavior or policy violations (e.g. sexual behaviors, physical aggression, verbal abuse, threats, other behaviors that cause harm or put themselves/others at risk of being harmed).

**No refunds or credits** are granted for missed days of Day Camp due to disciplinary action.

## Program Policies

Noble Summer Day Camp policies have been created and utilized in order to protect the campers involved in all youth programs. Please read this section carefully and contact the Camp Director with any questions that may arise.

### **Confidentiality**

Camper's records are open only to the appropriate Noble Worship & Community Center staff members and the camper's Parent/Guardian(s). Persons having access to the camper's records will not discuss or disclose personal information regarding the child(ren) and their relatives except to the Parent/Guardian(s) or other person authorized by the Parent/Guardian(s) or as required by state law.

### **Cancellations/Refunds**

- Refunds are only issued if a Day Camp week is cancelled by the Noble Worship & Community Center and an alternate option has not been given.
- All refunds require prior approval. Cash or money order payments will be refunded by check and mailed to the indicated home address. It will take approximately 8 to 10 business days for the check to arrive.

### **Late Pick-Up Fee**

Our Day Camp program ends promptly at 4:30PM. All campers must be picked up by then. If an emergency arises, please call the Noble Worship & Community Center and notify the Camp Director concerning a late arrival. **A late fee of \$1 per minute will be assessed after a 15-minute grace period. If a Parent/Guardian is consistently late two days a week or more, a late fee of \$10 will be charged per day that the Parent/Guardian is late picking up their child.** If a child is not picked up by 5:00 PM, local authorities will be contacted. The late fee must be paid to the Camp Director via cash or money order.

## **Discharge of Enrolled Campers**

Noble's Summer Day Camp reserves the right to deny services under any of the following conditions:

- The Day Camp has reached capacity for proper operation.
- Previous failure to comply with payments at time of service.
- Failure of Parent/Guardian(s) to observe any Day Camp policy.
- A camper shows continued disciplinary concerns.
- Camp staff is unable to meet the individual or unique needs of the camper after every appropriate and reasonable effort has been made.

The Day Camp staff will make every reasonable effort to keep a camper in the program. If there are recurrent issues that cause program disruption, safety concerns, an inability to meet the camper's needs or a severe incident has occurred requiring immediate action, the Camp Director and Noble Corps Officer(s) will conduct a consultation with the Parent/Guardian(s) to better understand the circumstances and to create an agreed upon plan of action.

Should the need arise where a camper must be asked to leave the program, personal contact with the Parent/Guardian(s) will be initiated by the Camp Director. A plan for the camper's return at a future date will be discussed and agreed to, if applicable, and the terms under which the camper may return will be clearly defined.

The Parent/Guardian may also initiate this process should they feel there are issues that cannot be agreed upon. Parental/Guardian requests for removal from the program must be addressed as soon as possible and no later than the next business day after the request is made.

## **Drop-Off & Pick-Up Procedures**

### **Safety**

The Salvation Army Noble Worship & Community Center is a public facility, and the surrounding parking lots are sometimes utilized during drop-off and pick-up times. Please keep in mind the safety of others, as well as the camper.

**Campers may not check themselves in or out of the program. An authorized adult must be present for drop-off and pick-up.** Authorized adults must be included on each camper application.

- Drop-Off
  - Drop-off **will begin at 8:30AM. Early arrival is not available.** Parent/guardian must check camper in on KidCheck Computer in the Lobby. When check-in is complete, campers will proceed to Fellowship Hall to hang up their belongings on the coat rack and cubbies and participate in supervised morning free-time.
- Late Drop-Off
  - Campers arriving late may miss out on trips with the camp. Please check the schedule ahead of time to ensure campers arrive on time with the necessary items. Additionally, if the camp has left Noble Worship & Community Center, the Parent/Guardian(s) may need to bring the camper to the group.

### **Pick-Up**

Campers should be picked up no later than **4:30PM.**

- **Requirements**

- Authorized Pick-Up
  - Authorized adults must be listed on the Authorized Pick-Up section of the Registration Form. Parent/Guardian(s) must provide verbal or written permission to update the approved list.
- **Valid Identification**
  - To prove identification, the adult must present a current picture I.D. Accepted forms of identification include valid state-issued identification card, driver's license, military identification card, or passport.
- **Custody Concerns**
  - Staff may not deny a legal Parent/Guardian access to their child without the proper legal documentation; said documentation must be on file.
- **Early Pick-Up**
  - If pick-up is expected to be before 4 pm, please inform the Camp Director in advance to better guarantee the camper is ready, but please be understanding that this process takes time.
- **Regular Pick-Up**
  - At 4:00PM, Campers will head to the Fellowship Hall for snack and closing activities. Parent/guardian will check out their student(s) on KidCheck and camp staff will radio for student(s) to come out.
  - Campers must be picked up by 4:30PM.
  - Late pick-up may result in late fees being accrued. If you foresee an upcoming circumstance that may result in a late pickup, please notify the Camp Director as soon as possible to come up with a plan.

### **Release of Camper to Impaired Persons**

If a Parent/Guardian (or authorized adult) appears to be impaired, the Day Camp staff will follow these steps for safety of the campers:

- The Noble Worship & Community Center and Day Camp staff will express concern for the condition that the person appears to be in and will state the danger that their condition places the camper in.
- Staff will try to contact the other Parent/Guardian (or authorized adult) to pick up the camper.
- If another authorized adult is unavailable to pick up the camper, Day Camp staff may contact the proper authorities if it is determined to be in the best interest of the camper.
- If the person refuses the above procedures and attempts to leave the property with the camper, Day Camp staff will call local law enforcement.
- Under no circumstances will Day Camp staff intervene and take the camper home.

These procedures are in place and will be carried out for the safety of all involved.

## **Camp Leaders**

Our trained staff is made up of people who are excited to spend their time playing, teaching, and working with the campers. All Day Camp staff members are trained in basic First Aid/CPR, and Safe from Harm, through extensive training to prepare for the summer. Parent/Guardian(s) can be assured that we are hiring the “best of the best” to work with the campers.

## **Communications**

### **Updates to Authorization List**

Only the Parent/Guardian that enrolled the camper may change the list of individuals authorized or NOT authorized to pick-up the camper. This should be done in-person and identification is required.

Many times, campers in our care will have Parent/Guardian(s) that have sole custody, joint custody, or another arrangement. If a Parent/Guardian has legal documentation restraining a Parent/Guardian from obtaining access to a camper, we must have a copy of the legal verification/documentation in our files; otherwise, we cannot deny access to a legal Parent/Guardian.

### **Contacting a Camper**

We understand that urgent situations arise. If a Parent/Guardian should ever need to reach a camper while at Noble’s Summer Day Camp, they should call the Noble Front Desk, 763-425-0517, or the Camp Director’s Cell Phone, **651-370-0736**. A Day Camp staff member will be able to reach the camper’s leader to either relay the message or bring the camper to the nearest phone.

### **Cell Phone Policy**

Social development is one of our top values; however, use of cell phones creates a distraction and a “disconnect” between campers and the impact of the activities being led; as well as their overall involvement with peers and the program. Campers are not permitted to have cell phones on them during the program.

### **Contacting Staff**

Exchange of information between Parent/Guardian(s) and staff provides insight for both parties. It is vital that we are informed of changes in a camper’s life so the staff may provide the best care possible. We will treat this information with the utmost confidence and concern.

There are several methods in which Parent/Guardian(s) may contact the Day Camp staff:

- **Registration Forms**: Parent/Guardian(s) are encouraged to indicate any circumstances that may affect the camper’s experience at Day Camp on the registration forms.
- **Telephone**: Parent/Guardian(s) may call the Noble Worship & Community Center and ask for the staff or contact the Camp Director’s work phone.
- **Email**: Written notification is an excellent way to communicate information about a camper; as well as specific questions or concerns that arise. General questions may be emailed to the Camp Director at [kelly.lindell@usc.salvationarmy.org](mailto:kelly.lindell@usc.salvationarmy.org). Anticipate an email or phone response within 24 hours, Monday through Friday.
- **In-Person**: The Camp Director is usually actively leading or facilitating youth ministry programming. In-person conversations should be scheduled in advance to ensure proper availability.

## **Medical Protocol**

If a camper has any medical needs requiring assistance or accommodation, please include this information on the Registration Form. This includes all medical or behavioral diagnoses that may affect a camper's experience regardless of if the camper takes medication for the condition as knowledge assists the staff in providing the best care possible. Feel free to contact the Camp Director to discuss individual needs.

### **Medications**

Medications administered during Damp Camp require written instruction, which can be listed in the Medical Section of the Registration Form. All medication(s) must be dropped off in the original prescription container with the camper's name printed on the label. Please place the medication in a clear plastic bag with the camper's name clearly marked.

- Centrally Stored Medication
  - Authorized adults must drop off and pick up all medications at the beginning and/or end of each week. Any medication left overnight is documented in the Centrally Stored Medication Log.
  - All medication will be stored in a locked safe, in a locked closet with access by the Camp Director and authorized staff members.
  - If medication is needed during a field trip, the Camp Director will bring medication with them and keep medication with Camp Director at all times.
- Medication Administration
  - The Camp Director or authorized staff will administer all medications according to the directions on the prescription bottles or any additional instructions given by the prescribing physician.

### **Illness at Camp**

Noble's Summer Day Camp is not designed to handle ill campers. If a camper becomes ill while at Day Camp, our staff will contact the camper's Parent/Guardian for pick-up.

### **Injury at Camp**

Staff will treat minor injuries requiring application of a bandage or ice. If further medical attention is required or if we are unsure of the severity of the injury, Parent/Guardian(s) will be notified immediately. The Emergency Medical System (911) will be activated at the discretion of the Camp Director. If we are unable to reach the Parent/Guardian(s), staff will continue calling the Emergency Contacts listed on the Registration Form.
